

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## THE WILD MOCCASIN DANCERS



November 15 is Rock Your Mocs Day, a day when all are invited to wear their moccasins. Moccasins are traditional footwear of many Indigenous people in North America. As part of this celebration, the Wild Moccasin Dancers were invited to perform in an assembly. The dancers entered the assembly with the Grass Dance, followed by the Women's Fancy Shawl Dance, and the Men's Traditional Dance. Students and staff had fun participating in several dances.

## "Fatty Legs" Author Visit

Divisions 1 and 3 were able to meet with Christy Jordan-Fenton, a co-author of "Fatty Legs." This is a book about a young Inuit girl name Olemaun, who goes to a residential school with a great desire to read. Before she leaves, her dad warns her: "as water wears rock smooth, her spirit will be worn down and made small." At the end of the book Olemaun says, "We Inuvialuit are headstrong. Thankfully, we are also resilient.... Wrens can be just as clever as ravens and owls."

Dear Parents, Guardians and Students,

#### Regarding the need to report student vaccination status

The B.C. government requires that all students in B.C. have their vaccination status reported. This regulation allows public health to collect all student immunization records. All records are stored in the provincial immunization registry. See <u>B.C.'s Vaccination Status Reporting</u> <u>Regulation for students</u> for more information.

Collecting immunization records helps public health control outbreaks and keep students healthy and safe. If there is a disease outbreak at a school from a disease that can be prevented by vaccines, public health can quickly find out which child is protected and which child is not. This allows us to act quickly and limit exposure. This is important to keep your child safe and to stop an outbreak from spreading.

Read below to learn more about what is happening in each grade this year for vaccination reporting and immunization clinics.

#### A. For children in Kindergarten

Our Public Health staff checks the immunization records we have on file. We might contact families of children who have missing or incomplete records.

#### B. For students in Grades 6 and Grade 9

- Our Public Health nurses will offer immunizations at your school.
- Before the immunization clinics at your school, we send home a consent form for each student.
- Check the immunization record on the consent form. If you have more immunization
  records that are not listed on the consent form, please submit them to public health at
  fraserhealth.ca/immunizationform.

#### C. For students in all other grades (includes Grades 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, 11 and 12)

Please check immunization records:

Immunization records can be viewed at healthgateway.gov.bc.ca.

Records for students 11 years of age and younger can be viewed on the parent/guardian account.

Students 12 years of age and older need to create their own account.

If you cannot access Health Gateway and you do not have the records on file, you might need to contact the health care provider who immunized your child to request the record. If your child was immunized by Fraser Health public health, then we have the records on file.

Review the "Immunization Forecast" in Health Gateway to see which immunizations are overdue or missing from the record.



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### • If an immunization shows as "overdue", but you know it was already given:

Submit the record to public health. You can submit it online at <u>fraserhealth.ca/immunizationform</u> or drop the record off at your local public health unit.

Be sure the record you are submitting has the student's

- full name
- date of birth
- sex at birth
- Personal health number (PHN) if available.

You can also give immunization records to a community health nurse in a First Nations community.

#### If an immunization is due or missing:

Book an appointment with your local public health unit, family practitioner, or pharmacist. Not all family practitioners and pharmacies give vaccines, so please call ahead.
