



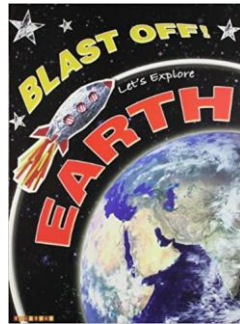
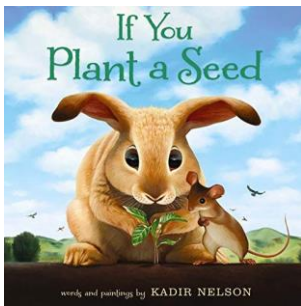

What Students Have Been Up To

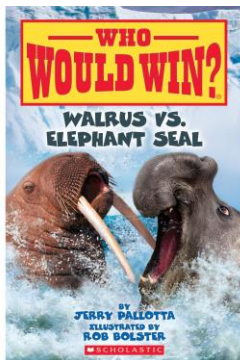
Grades K-2

- Researching about plants and creating mini-books.

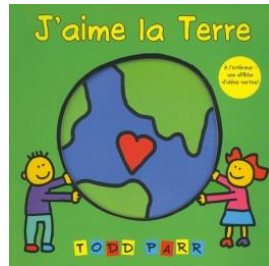
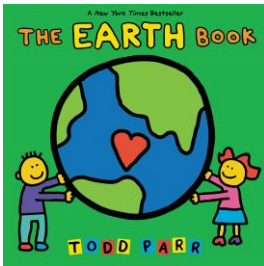


Grades 5-6

To compliment Earth Week activities teachers used The Earth Week book by Todd Parr, available at school in English and French.



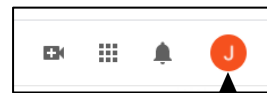
A few notes on book circulation:

Technology Corner

YouTube can be a fantastic source of information and entertainment, but can also include dangerous / inappropriate content. Below are some tips to use YouTube safely:

- To remove offensive language and videos, you can turn on 'Restricted Mode'. To do this, click on the 3 dots or the colored circle for your account in the top right corner for a drop down menu, and then click on 'Restricted Mode' at the bottom.

- When you find a video to watch, it's a good idea to check the channel to see if there is any inappropriate content.
