Metis Dancers!



To celebrate all Indigenous cultures, we will be having **Métis Dancers** on <u>Thursday, March 4, 2021</u>. The students will be learning the most famous Métis dance, the Red River Jig or as it is known in Michif, "oayache mannin". The accompanying fiddle tune is considered an



unofficial Métis anthem. The tune was very popular in the mid 1800s and was known from Alaska to James Bay. The dance is a combination of Plains First Nations footwork with Scottish, Irish and French-Canadian dance forms.

The basic jig step is danced in most Métis communities. However, dancers often add their own "fancy" dance steps during certain segments of the tune. Some dancers use fancy steps to identify their home community.

Salish Art!



Students continue to learn Coast Salish art from Ovila Mailhot. Ovila is a graphic artist, and originally comes from both Sto:lo and Nlaka'pamux Nation. He grew up on Seabird Island, located near Agassiz. Ovila's parents both share a creative streak and love for art. His father spent time with the mediums of painting and illustrating, while his mother focused on writing. His sister is a New York Times best selling author of "Heart Berries."
