Dear Parents/Guardians,

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

Indigenous Veterans Day

"Did you know that November 8th is annually recognized as National Indigenous Veterans Day in Canada?

National Indigenous Veterans Day started in Winnipeg in 1994 to honour all First Nations, Mètis and Inuit soldiers who served in war for Canada.

Prior to 1994, Indigenous soldiers were not permitted to participate in Remembrance Day ceremonies as a group or to lay wreaths. Indigenous veterans were only allowed to attend as an individual.

1994 was the first year that an Indigenous soldier placed a wreath at the Cenotaph in Ottawa. It wasn't until 1995 that Indigenous soldiers were allowed to march as a group or lay a wreath at the Cenotaph in Vancouver." (North Vancouver School District)

Cree Code Talkers

"Code talkers were First Nations soldiers in World War II who spoke Cree. They were the Canadian military's secret weapon.

When the military had to communicate secret messages, they would use code talkers. This meant sending the message in Cree to another code talker. Then it would get translated back into English...

Code talkers were sworn to secrecy about their jobs. Because of that, no one really knows much about who they were.

But the most famous Canadian code talker was a man named Charles Tomkins. But everyone called him Checker." For more information as well as short video

Fundraising:
